Participants will learn evidence-based interventions tailored to the emotional complexities of fertility treatment. The training also highlights culturally humble care, measurement-based assessments, and digital supports to strengthen engagement and track progress. Through case examples and treatment templates, attendees will gain a practical framework to improve care consistency, enhance outcomes, and reduce provider burnout—meeting the growing need for specialized fertility-related mental health support."
